Alice Saddy Association: Service Coordination in Long Term Care Homes

How does an adult with a developmental disability negotiate what he/she needs while living in a long term care home? The Service Coordination program provides support to individuals with developmental disabilities who live in long term care homes to sustain quality of life. Services include education, assistance with behavior programs, family support, referrals to specialists, transportation coordination, consultation with clinicians and direct support to individuals. This presentation will cover the history, funding, resource requirements, benefits and the need for more similar supports across Ontario.

You will receive instructions about the online learning and how to participate 3 days prior to your phase 1 learning session.

How this works

There are 3 parts to this learning process. We strongly encourage that you commit to each of the 3 phases, as each part builds on the next. Only those that participate in all 3 phases will receive a certificate of completion!

1. **PHASE 1: FIRESIDE CHAT (Thursday February 24, 2011 3:00 p.m. - 4:30 p.m.)** - You will participate in an online 'fireside chat' where the program representative and coach will present their project outlining the important milestones in the planning, development, implementation and evaluation of their program and / or partnership. There will be an opportunity for discussion, questions and answers.
Phase 1 time commitment = 1 1/2 hour
2. **PHASE 2: ONSITE PARTNERSHIP BUILDING AND COACHING (Friday February 25 through to Wednesday March 30)** - You will be provided with a knowledge transfer tool that outlines a process to: identify opportunities, identify and engage stakeholders and determine what's in it for stakeholders / partners - as well as you! In addition, the 4 weeks following the fireside chat presentation you and your learning group will have the opportunity to post questions and discuss issues using an on-line discussion forum. The program representative and coach will respond to your questions or concerns! *Phase 2 time commitment is entirely up to you. However, we recommend you commit a minimum of 4 hours over the course of 4 weeks to explore the possibilities within your organization and community!*
3. **PHASE 3: KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE (Thursday March 31, 2011 from 3:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.)** - Follow up on-line 'knowledge exchange' session with the program representative and coach to discuss what strategies you have tried, successes, challenges and sustainability. *Phase 3 time commitment = 1 1/2 hour*
