# AGING, DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AND MENTAL HEALTH

## BACKGROUND

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A 2006 a two day conference sponsored by the Southeastern Ontario Aging and Developmental Disabilities committee was held in Kingston, Ontario to assemble experts in the field of aging, developmental disabilities and mental health.

Day One of the conference provided educational sessions for attendees about the needs of individuals who are aging. The focus of Day Two was to create a common vision and mission regarding aging, developmentally disabled individuals who have or are developing mental health problems. The group was asked the question, *“To move forward collaboratively on this issue, what needs to be done?”* One of the actions identified by attendees was to provide educational sessions to those working in the field who could not attend the conference. This videoconference series repeat sessions from the conference. We hope to facilitate a dialogue across sectors and among care providers to provide a forum for the exchange of knowledge and sharing of ideas. Also, by broadening our understanding of the services provided by each of the sectors and by listening to experts in this field, a best practices framework can be developed to overcome some of the barriers that are faced by care providers. A question and answer session will follow each presentation.
